
# Projected Funding Available for Nonpoint in SFY 2024



■ Section 319

Centennial

■ CWSRF Loan (includes forgivable principal for GPR projects)







## **Match and Maximums**

- Nonpoint: NO match required as of SFY 2024!
- On Site Sewage (OSS): Repair and replacement requires 100% match (newer program)
- Maximum grant amount: \$500,000
- 36-month agreement duration
  - Potential to extend up to 12 months (depending on funding source)


# **Grant Eligibility: Land Acquisitions!**

### Property purchase & conservation easements for:

- Riparian areas
- Watershed protection
- Wetland preservation and protection
- Drinking source water protection

# **Eligible Grant Activities: Restoration**

- Riparian buffers
  - New Voluntary Clean Water Guidance
- Lakes
  - Phased process required
- Wetlands

Creation

**Buffer Required** 

- Stream
  - Grading and bank stabilization
  - Installation of large woody debris
  - Channel re-establishment/re-meander

# Eligible Grant Activities: Agricultural BMPs

- Conservation-based tillage
  - Direct seed, high residue retention
- Livestock feeding & off-stream watering BMPs
  - Heavy Use Area Protection
    - Associated confinement fencing
  - Waste Storage Facilities
    - Permanent roof, curbed concrete floors, designed and stamped by an engineer
- Livestock exclusion

**Buffer Required** 

- Native tree and shrub planting required within fencing setbacks (grass filter strips alone are not sufficient)
- VCWG Chapter 12: Riparian Areas.

# **Ineligible activities:**

- BMP implementation on state/federal lands
  - Rare exceptions on case-by-case basis
- Funding application preparation
- Previously funded objectives
  - cannot fund "do-overs"
  - Phased projects should have clear, distinct objectives for each phase

#### **Buffer Guidelines:**

- Federal terms and conditions are applied to all 319,
   State Revolving Funds (SRF), and Centennial match funds
- Based on our new Voluntary Clean Water Guidance for Agriculture
  - Voluntary Clean Water Guidance for Agriculture Riparian
    - Tables 1-5 (pages 25b-28b) Chapter 12
- Width measured from Ordinary Highwater Mark (OHWM)
- Mapping tool indicates which buffer width applies

# **Guidelines: Agricultural BMPs**

## Caps on direct seed

- Equipment rental or custom application fee reimbursement
  - \$30/acre up to 250 acres per landowner/producer, 3 rotations
  - Cap increased to 500 acres with riparian buffer
- Equipment purchase
  - \$187,000 one-time grant for a public entity

# **Grant Eligibility: Conservation Plans for water quality**



#### Eligible

✓ • Site visits to discuss water quality impacts from the property

Writing up recommendations and conceptual plans for livestock exclusion fencing and off-stream water sources

## Not Eligible

 Nutrient management plans (except WITH waste storage facility construction)

 Farm plans (general) or other proprietary plans

- Groundwater Protection (section 2.5.4)
- Public Outreach & Education (section 2.5.7, Appendix H)
- Technical Assistance & Conservation Plans (section 2.5.9)
- Water Quality Monitoring (section 2.5.10)

# **Eligible Loan Activities**

- All grant-eligible activities
- Direct seed equipment purchasing program
- Irrigation efficiency implementation
- On-site septic repair & replacement
- Wetland creation

# Project Schedule - Tips 🌟



- July 1<sup>st</sup> is the earliest reimbursable start date
  - July-September for planning and reviews
- Early October is typically earliest start for on the ground implementation – after reviews are complete
  - ~2 months for Cultural resource review
    - Final determination could require a survey
  - ~1-3 months BMP approval
    - Includes review of site plans, BMP Approval Form, ensures work will be reimbursed
  - ~2-3 months for Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP)
    - Required for monitoring
